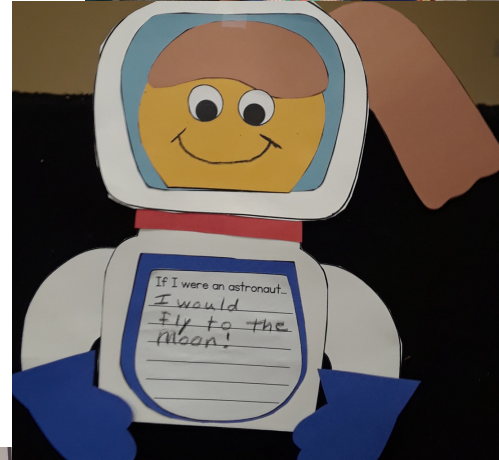
Summer Reading is in Full Swing at the Library
