We are pleased to announce that the Sikeston Public Library has been awarded a Summer Library Program grant in the amount of \$9,478 for summer reading activities this year.


Funding from the Summer Library Program grant pays for the summer reading presenters and funds our programming to the Y, Lincoln University Extension, and Early Head Start.
